The Boat Window at Chapel

Boats are mentioned so many times in the Bible, that seeing one depicted in a sanctuary window might remind one person of one thing, while reminding someone else of something completely different. The boat is a traditional symbol for the missionary nature of the church, as with St. Paul who journeyed throughout the Roman Empire by boats in the Mediterranean Sea. If we think of Peter watching from the boat as Jesus walked on the water, we might be reminded how we are also called, as was Peter, to step out in faith. Jesus calmed the stormy waters from a boat threatened by the winds and waves. With these and all the other instances of boats in Scripture, we can also add something that Clement of Alexandria once said: "The whole business of the church is like a ship, bearing through a violent storm the people who are of many places and who desire to live in the Kingdom of God."
