Operation Christmas Child



Jaki....Jaki never knew her mother, as she was taken to an orphanage in Guatemala when she was just a few months old. The caretakers at the orphanage could provide only for basic needs of the children. They taught them and clothed them, but with limited resources, the children ate a steady diet of rice and beans. They wore whatever clothing was available, no matter what size or whether they were boys or girls styles .They did have a toothbrush – one for ten girls! They had to share. That's why Jaki was very excited to receive a shoebox gift. In it was a toothbrush of her very own! Today when Jaki packs shoeboxes, she always includes at least four of them. That way, the recipients can give them to their friends. Jaki also received a stuffed animal, which she loved to hug, and crayons and coloring books. When she and the other girls colored, they filled every available space with color! Jaki's gifts came in a plastic container, and she stored larger items in it. However, her most cherished items were hidden under her mattress - especially the photos and letters of the people who had sent her the box.

Jaki learned about Jesus at the orphanage. When she received her box, she learned "Jesus Loves Me". She still loves that song, and loves to sing. A couple in the United States adopted her. Today, she is on the worship committee at her church and is a nanny, so she can teach the song to the children. Jaki hopes that her story will make a difference to those who pack the boxes and to those who will receive them.
