My Shoebox Was A Seed



Fourteen year old, Oksana, and her family lived in the Ukraine, about an hour away from Poland. Times were hard for Oksana's family, but receiving a shoebox gift which contained a purple comb was the beginning of a change in her heart. That comb, a simple gift sent by strangers, made her feel special and important. Years later, after she was married and was finishing schooling, she surrendered her life to Christ. 'My Shoebox Was A Seed'. She became involved in children's ministry, but wrestled with how to best communicate God's love to the boys and girls. While praying about it, she remembered her purple comb. She thanked God for the person who included the comb in her shoebox. The Lord used the comb to give her insight into her ministry. In small things, children can see something very big....

Oksana used 'The Greatest Journey' as a tool for sharing the Gospel with children – a discipleship course for shoebox recipients to learn more about how to follow Christ and tell others about Him.
